

Davis writer pens book on Food Bank

The Food Bank of Yolo County will celebrate the release of Davis author and historian Shipley Walters' book: "From Pantry to Food Bank: The First Forty Years" (published by AuthorHouse) with an author reception and book signing on Friday, June 25, from 7:30 p.m. to 10 p.m. at The Avid Reader Book Store, 617 Second St., Davis.

In "From Pantry to Food Bank: The First Forty Years," Walters chronicles the evolution of the Food Bank from its inception as a volunteer effort in the early 1970s, to its existence today as a thriving resource center that feeds between 18,000 to 20,000 people every month. Author Walters will be on-hand to sign copies of the book, which features a foreword by Food Bank Executive Director Jose Martinez.

The book will be available in both paperback and hardcover, and will retail for \$12.95 and \$19.95, respectively. All of the proceeds generated from the sale of this book will be donated to the Food Bank of Yolo County.
